Councilman Berent for the Capital Improvements Committee presented a report from National Fuel Gas setting forth the results of a heating survey for the Lancaster Town Hall and Highway Garage.

The Town clerk was directed to put this report on the communication part of the agenda for the next Town Board meeting.

Councilman Czaplá, for the Investigating Committee, reported that the engineer on the Court Street Bridge project has recommended acceptance of the project and that the Investigating Committee would make a final inspection on or about May 27, 1980.

Councilman Grzybowski reported that the Depew village Board does not have sufficient funding in their current budget for the installation of sidewalks on Warner Road between Columbia Avenue and the Town line, however, the Village Board, the Village Superintendent of Public Works, and the Town Highway Superintendent are working together for the extension of the basic culverts under Warner Road to accommodate a walkway and future site area for sidewalk installation.

Supervisor Keysa reported that the plans for restoration of the Opera House were sent to the State on Friday, May 16, 1980, for approval.

Supervisor Keysa reported that Chief Fowler, Highway Superintendent Urban, and he attended a recent conference on disaster preparedness.

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Lancaster deems it in the public interest upon the recommendation of the office of the Building Inspector and Town Attorney's Office of the Town of Lancaster, to amend the Zoning Ordinance of the Town of Lancaster known as Chapter 50 of the Code of the Town of Lancaster by repealing Section 50-116 and Section 50-117 of the Code of the Town of Lancaster, Zoning Ordinance, entitled respectively "Inspection" and "Penalties", heretofore adopted by the Town Board of the Town of Lancaster on May 24, 1961, and to enact in place thereof, the following:

CHAPTER 50

ZONING

ARTICLE XXIV

Administration, Enforcement and Violations

§50-116 Inspection.

The Building Inspector is hereby empowered to cause any building, other structure or tract of land to be inspected and examined for suspected violations of the Zoning Ordinance.

Upon finding a violation involving the construction or continuous use of any building, other structure or tract of land, the Building Inspector may issue an Order to Remedy such violation. After such order has been served on the owner, agent, tenant, lessee, manager, operator or employee thereof, of any building, structure or tract of land, or any builder, contractor or architect or an employee thereof, who commits or assists in a violation, no work or activity shall proceed, except to correct the violation to comply with such order.

Where the Building Inspector finds an event or activity planned which will be in violation of the Zoning Ordinance, the Building Inspector may issue a Notice to the owner, agent, tenant, lessee, manager, operator or employee thereof, informing him of the violation if such event or activity occurs.

Nothing herein shall be construed to prevent the Building Inspector from enforcing the Zoning Ordinance, by issuance of appearance tickets, where violations have occurred, even though an Order to Remedy or Notice of Violation may not have been served.

§50-117. Penalties.

- (A) Pursuant to §268 of Article 16 of the Town Law, a violation of this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an offense, punishable by a fine not exceeding two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) or imprisonment for a period of not to exceed six (6) months, or both.

Each week's continued violation shall constitute a separate additional violation and shall be punishable hereunder, except where such a violation is a single occurrence or activity or series of occurrences or activities, and in that case, each such occurrence or activity shall constitute a separate additional violation and shall be punishable as such hereunder.

- (B) A person, partnership, firm or corporation who owns the land in question, or any agent, lessee, tenant, manager or operator of said property or any employee of said aforementioned parties, or any builder, contractor or architect, or employee thereof, or other person who commits or assists in committing the violation of any section of the Zoning Ordinance shall be subject to the penalties imposed by this ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that pursuant to Section 130 of the Town Law of the State of New York, a public hearing on the said proposed repeal of Section 50-116 and Section 50-117 of the Zoning Ordinance of the Town of Lancaster, known as Chapter 50 of the Code of the Town of Lancaster, and enactment of a new Section 50-116 and Section 50-117 of the Code of the Town of Lancaster will be held at the Town Hall, 21 Central Avenue, Lancaster, New York, on the 2nd day of June, 1980 at 8:00 o'clock P.M., Local Time, and that Notice of the time and place of such hearing be published on May 22, 1980, in the Lancaster Enterprise, being a newspaper of general circulation in said Town, and posted on the Town Bulletin Board, which Notice shall be in the form attached hereto and made a part hereof.

CHAPTER 50

ZONING

ARTICLE XXIV

Administration, Enforcement and Violations

§50-116 Inspection.

The Building Inspector is hereby empowered to cause any building other structure or tract of land to be inspected and examined for suspected violations of the Zoning Ordinance.

Upon finding a violation involving the construction or continuous use of any building, other structure or tract of land, the Building Inspector may issue an Order to Remedy such violation. After such order has been served on the owner, agent, tenant, lessee, manager, operator or employee thereof, of any building, structure or tract of land, or any builder, contractor or architect or an employee thereof, who commits or assists in a violation, no work or activity shall proceed, except to correct the violation to comply with such order.

Where the Building Inspector finds an event or activity planned which will be in violation of the Zoning Ordinance, the Building Inspector may issue a Notice to the owner, agent, tenant, lessee, manager, operator or employee thereof, informing him of the violation if such event or activity occurs.

Nothing herein shall be construed to prevent the Building Inspector from enforcing the Zoning Ordinance, by issuance of appearance tickets, where violations have occurred, even though an Order to Remedy or Notice of Violation may not have been served.

§50-117. Penalties.

- (A) Pursuant to §268 of Article 16 of the Town Law, a violation of this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an offense, punishable by a fine not exceeding two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) or imprisonment for a period of not to exceed six (6) months, or both.

Each week's continued violation shall constitute a separate additional violation and shall be punishable hereunder, except where such a violation is a single occurrence or activity or series of occurrences or activities, and in that case, each such occurrence or activity shall constitute a separate additional violation and shall be punishable as such hereunder.

- (B) A person, partnership, firm or corporation who owns the land in question, or any agent, lessee, tenant, manager or operator of said property or any employee of said aforementioned parties, or any builder, contractor or architect, or employee thereof, or other person who commits or assists in committing the violation of any section of the Zoning Ordinance shall be subject to the penalties imposed by this ordinance.

Full opportunity to be heard will be given to any and all citizens and all parties in interest.

WHEREAS, said program, as presently envisioned, would provide nutritious hot meals at minimum cost to senior citizens in the Town of Lancaster at the Central Avenue Elementary School, and

WHEREAS, the Lancaster-Depew Rotary Club has spearheaded a successful fund raising drive and donated \$2,500.00 of its funds to the total of \$5,040.00 raised by contributions from a number of service organizations, religious and fraternal groups and private individuals and corporations, as set forth in greater detail in the report of the Supervisor dated May 19, 1980, which total sum of \$5,040.00 has been deposited in the Town's General Fund Account, and

WHEREAS, as set forth in the report of the Supervisor, a lease has been negotiated with the Lancaster Central School District for the use of the Central Avenue School for the program, and an agreement tendered by the Erie County Office for the Aging for meal preparation and other services to be provided by said Agency, and

WHEREAS, the Recreation Commission, through its Senior Citizens Director, is providing important coordination work for the program and the Recreation Commission will shortly appoint a manager for the program, and

THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WAS OFFERED  
BY COUNCILMAN BERENT , WHO MOVED  
ITS ADOPTION, SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN

WHEREAS, town and village courts hear and determine cases involving violations of state law, and

WHEREAS, fines and penalties collected by such courts are paid to the state in recognition of the fact that such violations are state offenses, and

WHEREAS, in recognition of the services provided by such local courts the State of New York has provided in Section 99-1 of the General Municipal Law that towns and villages shall be reimbursed for services rendered in such cases in the amount of \$5.00 per case, and

WHEREAS, the amount of \$5.00 was originally set forth in the Code of Criminal Procedure, Section 740-a, by Chapter 737 of the Laws of 1939, and has remained unchanged for the past 41 years, and

WHEREAS, the per case costs of the operation of local courts have increased substantially since 1939 while no increase in reimbursement by the state to local governments for court services has been granted, and

WHEREAS, the net result is that the burden of the said additional cost of administering this state operation is borne by taxation of local real property rather than by general taxation;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that this body does hereby strongly urge the Legislature and the Governor to act favorably on pending legislation which would increase the amount returned to towns and villages to \$15.00 instead of the present inadequate \$5.00 limit as set by the present provisions of law (Senate 2397-A; Assembly 10900), and

BE IT FURTHER

RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution be forthwith forwarded to the HON. HUGH L. CAREY, Governor; HON. WARREN M. ANDERSON, President Pro Tem of the Senate; HON.
