17. On the north side of Pleasant View Drive from its intersection with Forton Drive westerly to a point one thousand five hundred (1,500) feet therefrom, and extending easterly from said intersection to a point one thousand eight hundred (1,800) feet therefrom.
18. On the south side of Pleasant View Drive from its intersection with Forton Drive westerly to a point one thousand five hundred (1,500) feet therefrom, and extending easterly from said intersection to a point one thousand eight hundred (1,800) feet therefrom.

- 19. On the west side of Forton Drive for its entire length.
- 20. On the east side of Forton Drive from its intersection with Pleasant View Drive to a point five hundred and twenty-five (525) feet south of said intersection.
